APPLICATION CRITERIA

The Coury and Kesslring Natural Resource Scholarship is to be awarded to a Calhoun County resident seeking to further their education in Natural Resources or a related field at any Michigan College or University. Qualifying applicants may begin education at a 2 year institution with plans to complete at a 4 year institution.

Amount of award: To be determined annually.

Number of recipients: One.

Renewable: Yes- but not guaranteed, must reapply.

GPA: Minimum 2.5.

Financial Aid: Not Required.

Recommendation Letter: Two- One from a high school educator/administrator or employer and one from an adult member of the community (not a family member).

Essay Questions: Please provide a one-page type written response to the following questions on a separate page, recording your name in the upper right hand corner.

- Why have you chosen to go into the natural resources field?
- Tell about experience or community service pertaining to natural resources (Agriculture experience, classes, FFA, 4-H, etc.)
