



Marshall Community Foundation Scholarship Application

The Marshall Community Foundation Scholarship has been established to provide scholarships for non-traditional student(s), defined as adults who are returning or have returned to school after a lapse of (1) or more years. Eligible applicants must reside in the Marshall area, prove financial need, and demonstrate leadership skills, a strong work ethic and a proven desire to be active in their community. GPA of 2.0 is required. Previous applicants and/or recipients may reapply.

The Marshall Community Foundation Scholarship can be applied towards:

- Technical training
- College education
- Company-related training/education

The scholarship may be granted within 12 months after awarded and is disbursed directly to the educational institution.

The number of recipients and the amount of the award(s) will be determined annually.

Recipients are responsible for knowledge of tax regulations regarding scholarships.

Applications are due by or must be postmarked no later than May 1

Marshall Community Foundation **Scholarship**

Description/Qualifying Criteria: *Scholarship(s) to be awarded to a Non-traditional student(s) defined as adults who are returning or have returned to school after a lapse of (1) or more years. Eligible applicants must reside in the Marshall area.*

Applicants are encouraged to apply if attending a two year or four year institution, in need of additional education and/or technical training to enhance current employment status or employability. Therefore, a scholarship award may be applied toward a college degree, technical training, certification program or company related training or education. The scholarship may be granted within 12 months after awarded and is paid directly to the institution.

Applicants must demonstrate financial need, leadership skills, strong work ethic and involvement within their community. A 2.0 GPA is required. Previous MCF Scholarship applicants and/or recipients are eligible to reapply.

Essay Questions: Yes, refer to application.

Recommendation Letters: Two required. One from a current employer and one from an adult member in the community and/or two from adult members in the community.

Financial Criteria: Yes, please complete the financial aid form included with application.

Application Checklist & Tips

Consider how your completed application will appear to the Scholarship Committee that is reviewing and recommending scholarship recipients to the Foundation Trustees. Appearance is important, as this application represents **you**.

The following suggestions will assist you in completing your best grant application.

1. Make a copy of the application and complete a draft before writing on the original application.
2. Respond to every question that applies to you or write N/A (not applicable) if it doesn't apply to you.
3. Include all supporting documentation (if requested). If you are unable to include the information requested, please explain why.
4. When you write about your personal ambitions and goals, provide enough information so that the Scholarship Committee clearly understands your plans and can recognize your potential.
5. If you do not type your responses, be sure that your handwriting is legible.
6. Double check your spelling.
7. Ask someone to proofread the application.
8. Make a copy of the completed application and attachments and keep in a safe place.
